





I year B. Pharm

- Mr. Md Majid, Assistant Professor in the faculty of Pharmaceutical Inorganic Chemistry, achieved an impressive 95.06% in the teaching-learning process, earning commendation from the Dean of the School of Pharmacy for outstanding performance across all teaching aspects.
- On the other hand, Ms T. Tulasi, Assistant Professor in the faculty of Remedial Mathematics, fell below the threshold value in various aspects of teaching. The Dean of the School of Pharmacy has advised her to enhance her teaching skills to meet the threshold value for the next assessment. She is required to report to the IQAC cell for further actions.

II year B. Pharm

- Dr. B. Madhavi Latha, a faculty member, attained a remarkable score of over 95.75%, receiving accolades from the Dean of the School of Pharmacy for exhibiting outstanding performance in all aspects of teaching.
- Contrastingly, Mrs. N. Swapna, an Associate Professor in the Faculty of Physical Pharmacy-I, did not meet the threshold value in various teaching aspects. • In contrast, Mr. K. Ravi Kumar, another faculty member, has excelled by securing above 99.5%. The Dean of the School of Pharmacy commended him for outstanding performance in all aspects of teaching, molecular Biology, Mr. B. Krishna, Associate Professor has not attained threshold value in all aspects of teaching. The Dean School of Pharmacy has been counselled and suggested he enhance the required teaching skills to attain threshold value for the next assessment and report to the IQAC cell for further actions.
