A Webinar on “National Education Policy-2020-Its Impact on Higher Education “organized by the School of Management Sciences in association with school of Pharmacy, NNRG on 1st June 2021 at 10.30 A.M. in online through Zoom medium. Dr.M.L.Sai Kumar, Former Dean (Academics), Institute of Public Enterprise (IPE), Hyderabad was invited to be the Guest speaker. At the outset, Dr. T. Ravindra Reddy, Dean, School of Management Sciences welcomed all the dignitaries of HoDs, faculty members and students of MBA, NNRG. He gave an introduction of the program and the importance of NEP-2020 and the new policy implications introduced by the Central Government. He informed to all the faculty members attended the programme to understand the aim and objectives of NEP-2020 for effective implementation. The chief guest is introduced by Mr.L.Srikanth, Asst Prof, SoMS, NNRG.

Prof. M.L.Sai Kumar, Chief Guest on the occasion gave speech to the participants and said that everyone should make use of their technical knowledge for new innovations keeping in view the changing trends in Higher Education. Accordingly, faculty should evolve various new innovations in research and it is their responsibility to encourage the students to focus on research on new developments, innovations keeping in view the present emerging trends. He said that NEP-2020 is for stakeholders as learn how to learn and the policy with an aim of quality in research, experimental learning, experiential learning, less regulations, more autonomy. It emphasis on self regulatory, local problems, encouragement of autonomy, entrepreneurship by encouraging innovation and creativity by more incubation centers. It improves competency from students in innovation. It is a student centric policy which allows multiple entry and exit to the courses, vocational education system, improving skills like critical thinking; problem solving can prepare the students for good employment as well towards entrepreneurship. He also described

about the challenges in the implementation that it is not easy task to take GDP from 3 to 6 percent and the present budget is major portion has been allocating to Covid pandemic influenced that allocating to more health and other eliminating activities. He pointed out that in the implementation there is a need of public funding, foreign collaboration, technology adoption by the students and faculty members. He said it is more challenging task in case of rural population, communication issues, below poverty level problems in case of digital education as the policy is encouraging more credit transfers. He said this policy requires uniform assessment skills requirement, new teaching methodologies, induction programs etc. He said that every person should feel the importance of human values without which the academic avenues and achievements carry no value. He said that faculty and students should focus on research that would be useful to the society.


The session is concluded by 12:00 PM by Dr.T.Ravindra Reddy, Dean, School of Management Sciences, NNRG.
