### OBE & NBA Accreditation

A Workshop on Outcome-Based Education (OBE) & National Board of Accreditation (NBA) Accreditation was conducted by NNRG SOP, Resource Person: Dr. S. Ravichand, Head of Department (HoD), Electronics and Communication Engineering (ECE) on 28th February 2024 to 29th February 2024 at Seminar Hall, School of Pharmacy. The workshop was attended by all the faculty members from the School of Pharmacy, including the Dean.

### **Objectives**

The main objectives of the workshop were to:
