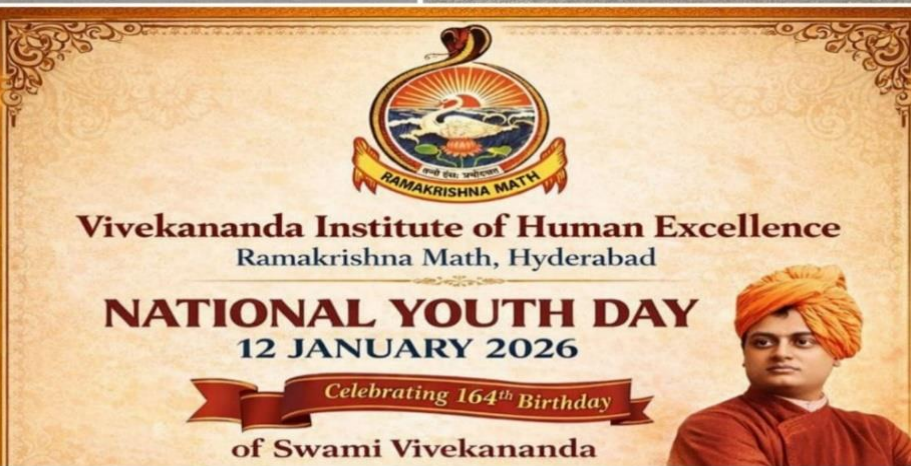


MOU with TASK
