He emphasized that the department has spacious laboratories and state-of-the-art equipment. Dr. Ravi highlighted that ECE students have the flexibility to work in either hardware or software domains. He also discussed the abundant opportunities in government sectors such as ISRO, defence laboratories, and other public organizations, in addition to the IT sector. Dr. Ravi mentioned that software is accessible to everyone, and emphasized the department's available facilities and the presence of 10 Ph.D. scholars. Furthermore, he noted that over 80% of the B.Tech (ECE) students have secured placements in hardware companies, and emphasized the increasing demand for ECE students in the near future.
